

EUMETSAT: the Meteosat satellites observe Africa better than Europe





- Meteosat data support Africa's aspirations for sustained development
- 30-year cooperation with EUMETSAT
 - User forum in Africa every 2nd year
 - Dedicated NRT data access service: EUMETCast-Africa (>400 VSAT stations across the African continent)
 - Uninterrupted series of EU-funded capacity building projects
- Next challenge: transition of African users from MSG to MTG-I
 - Launch of MTG-I1 end November 2022



African Artists for Development: contemporary African artists supporting development projects





Foundation created in 2009 by Gervanne and Matthias Leridon

"The involvement of contemporary African artists in supporting development projects is one of the best levers of recognition and guarantee of success for building the future of the African continent."

 - Selection of 54 contemporary artworks on Climate & Energy produced by artists from all 54 African countries









Convergence, opportunity, idea: African Space Art Project





- Combine support from Space (EUMETSAT) and contemporary African art (AAD) to Africa's development
- Opportunity: launch of MTG-I1, transition of African users from MSG to MTG-I
- Idea: African Space Art Project (ASAP)
 - Select a (pictural) contemporary artwork on space, climate/meteorology and the development of Africa
 - Display a copy on the fairing of the Ariane-5 rocket launching MTG-I1
 - Partnership with Arianespace
 - Send it into Space




ASAP kicked off on 24 September 2018

Involvement of African Union Commission



ASAP Artistic Jury selects 3 finalists on 4 March 2020



- 100 African contemporary artists invited to submit proposed artworks related to Space, Climate & Meteorology and Africa
- 60 proposals received (see <u>African Space Art Project | Facebook</u>) for pre-selection by Artistic Jury (Jean-Philippe Aka, Gaël Faye, Keziah Jones, Melissa Goba)






Sending African artwork into space: a symbolic gesture
